This course is designed to provide students with the opportunity to gain academic and practical experience in the recovery and analysis of the material remains of an ancient culture. The focus of the field school is on the archaeology of the southern Levant from the Bronze and Iron Ages.

The course takes place during the four-week dig season at Tel es-Safi that is identified as biblical Gath of the Philistines.

Students will participate in all aspects of the project, including both field and laboratory. In the field, they will participate in the various tasks that take place at the base camp, such as the washing and reading of pottery and bone.

Lectures on topics relating to the site, the archaeology of Israel, and archaeological methodology will be held twice weekly. The lectures will be presented by the project staff, as well as various distinguished guest lectures.

Tuition fees are payable to the University of Manitoba, plus applicable admission and other assessed fees. International students pay a tuition differential of 180%. Participants are responsible for their own travel arrangements and must be in Tel es-Safi, Israel in accordance with the published course dates.

All students applying for the course(s) must have the prerequisite ANTH 2100 (Introduction to Archaeological Research), an equivalent course, or receive permission of the instructor.

In order to participate in a travel/study course, all students must sign an Acknowledgement of Responsibility and Liability Waiver that outlines risk and shared responsibility associated with travel/study.

The University of Manitoba is only offering degree credit courses. All other arrangements are made directly with Tel es-Safi/Gath Archaeological Project.
