Celina Flores is a historian and holds a master's degree in international human rights law from the University of Buenos Aires. It has been developed for more than 20 years in the area of work of archives and human rights. She coordinated survey and declassification teams at the Ministry of Defense and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Argentina. Since 2015, she coordinates the documentary heritage area of Memoria Abierta.

Veronica Torras holds her Bachelor degree in Philosophy from the Faculty of Philosophy and Letters of the University of Buenos Aires (UBA). She obtained the Specialization in Collective Memories, Human Rights and Resistances of CLACSO. She is a doctoral student in Human Rights at the National University of Lanus (UNLa). She was Undersecretary of Communication of the Government of the City of Buenos Aires (2000-2004) and Director of the Memory in Motion Program of the Secretariat of Public Communication of the Nation (2011-2015). In addition, she worked in non-governmental spheres linked to the defense of human rights: she was Director of Communications at the Center for Legal Studies and Social, CELS, (2005-2010), and advisor to this organization until 2017. She has written numerous articles in academic and journalistic media about the struggles symbolic for memory, truth and justice and reparation. She is currently the Executive Director of Memoria Abierta, a leading Argentine organization at a regional and international level in memory practices, which since 2006 coordinates the Network of Latin American and Caribbean Memory Sites (RESLAC).
