About Fulbright: Excellence in scholarship, a commitment to diversity, and community service are the hallmarks of the Fulbright Program. In 1946, as the junior senator from Arkansas, J. William Fulbright introduced legislation to start a new international educational exchange program with an ambitious goal – to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and the people of other countries. The Fulbright Program now operates in 155 countries, and has supported over 300,000 students

Awards for Canadian Scholars

Visiting Research Chairs for Canadian Scholars in the United States: US\$25,000 for prominent and promising scholars and experienced professionals to conduct research, develop partnerships, and guest lecture at select partner institutions. Available Visiting Research Chairs by theme and university: **Arctic Studies** available at the University of Washington; **Canadian Studies** available at the University of California at Berkeley, Kennesaw State University, and Michigan State University; **Canada-U.S. Relations** available at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars; **Environmental Humanities** available at the University of California at Irvine; **Military Social Work** available at the University of Southern California; **Nano-technology** available at the University of California at Los Angeles; **Policy Studies** available at the University of Texas at Austin; **Public Diplomacy** available at the University of Southern California; **Quebec Studies** available at the Institute on Quebec Studies at The State University of New York in Plattsburg; **Science** available at the Illinois Institute of Technology; **War and Peace Studies** available at Norwich University; and **field open chairs** available at the University of California at Santa Barbara, and Vanderbilt University.

Traditional Scholars Awards: US\$12,500 for emerging and established scholars, postdoctoral researchers, and experienced professionals to conduct research, teach, or undertake a combination of these activities. The Traditional Awards for scholars is open to academics in all disciplines, and may be held at any university, research center, think tank, or government agency in the United States.

General Eligibility Requirements

- Canadian Citizenship.
- A Ph.D. or equivalent professional degree, or significant professional experience.
- Proficiency in English.

Award Details

- Grant length: 4 months.
- Awards are taken up September 2016 or January 2017.
- Deadline to apply: November 15, 2015.
- Grantees may seek an unfunded extension for up to 8 months.

All awards are subject to the availability of funding, approval by the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board (FSB), and compliance with FSB and USG guidelines.

Benefits of becoming a Fulbright Scholar

- Eligibility to apply for up to \$750 for the Outreach Lecturing Fund.
- Eligibility to apply for up to \$4,000 to propose an environmental initiative in Canada or the United States (Fulbright Canada-RBC Eco-Leadership Program).
- Eligibility to apply for up to \$8,000 to propose a community / social justice initiative in Canada (Fulbright Canada-U.S. Embassy in Ottawa Community Leadership Program).
- The opportunity to develop long-term research collaborations.
- Access to world-class universities and research facilities.
- Access to a prestigious network of Fulbright scholars.
- Exceptional comparative research opportunities.
- Sabbatical, leave-of-absence, or retirement pay may be used concurrently with Fulbright awards.
