



MANITOBA TRAINING PROGRAM FOR HEALTH SERVICES RESEARCH

The Manitoba Training Program for Health Services Research (MTP) is an applied, interdisciplinary training program for graduate students in health services research and is financially supported by Manitoba Health, Seniors, and Active Living (MHSAL).

The one year training program is offered to thesis-based Masters and PhD students.

- Annual fellowships of \$17,850 for Master's students and \$22,500 for PhD students
- Support to attend Canadian Association for Health Services and Policy Research Conference
- Participation in the MTP seminar course, CHSC 7730, which invites key decision-makers in Manitoba to discuss research needs and evidence-based decision-making in health care
- Enroll in credit for CHSC 7320, Organization and Finance of the Canadian Health Care System
- Field placements linking students with health services agencies and decision-makers in Winnipeg
- Networking opportunities through seminar class, placements, and participation in collaborative workshops
- Training to enhance professional skills, experiences, and contacts for academic and career development
