Feeding the World by Dr. Nan Enstad, University of Wisconsin Madison, Buttel-Sewell Professor of Community and Environmental Sociology

We think of agricultural policy developing in national capitols and the UN, but increasingly community-level conflicts over factory farms localize debate and decision-making regarding intensive animal agriculture. This paper explores a fight over a proposed hog factory farm in Polk and Burnett Counties, Wisconsin, by analyzing the competing world-making discourses and community-making food practices around the concept, "feeding the world." What gets mistaken as a left/right conflict is revealed to be a much more dynamic struggle over concepts of nature and economic futures.
