

**Limited Term Faculty Position in Spanish Language and Hispanic Linguistics

The Department of Modern Languages and Literatures invites applications for a limited term faculty position (one year) at the rank of Assistant Professor in Hispanic Language and Hispanic Linguistics. Applications will be considered from qualified applicants, who currently have, or will have attained a PhD by September 2018. The candidate will have a solid expertise in morphosyntactic theory, applied and second language acquisition, bilingualism, heritage languages and language teaching. Native or near-native fluency in Spanish are required. Expertise in Hispanic and/or Romance Linguistics is important. Responsibilities will include teaching undergraduate and graduate courses such as Spanish Syntax, Hispanic Linguistics, Second Language Acquisition, Comparative Grammar of English and Spanish, or Bilingualism and Spanish Morphology courses. Participation in graduate examinations and service to the Department and the Faculty are also required. This position will start July 1, 2018 and salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
