Decolonizing Perspectives in Indigenous Health

This course explores the impact of colonialism and systemic racism on Indigenous health outcomes in Canada, emphasizing the importance of decolonization in promoting health equity. It includes a critical examination of key determinants of health for Indigenous peoples, such as intergenerational trauma and cultural safety in health-care settings. The role of Indigenous knowledge systems in health and wellness will also be covered.
