Responsibilities: I work a .8 clinical position across three services in the Department of Clinical Health Psychology at St. Boniface Hospital: Medical Inpatient Consultation (assessment & brief treatment 2-12 sessions), Mental Health Inpatient Consultation (psychodiagnostic assessment), and the Outpatient Cognitive Assessment and Psychodiagnostic Service (CAPS). Medical inpatients present with critical and terminal illness, health-related trauma, chronic pain, birth trauma and postpartum complications, IBD, IBS, adjustment, grief, behavioural and mental health challenges impacting adherence to medical intervention, delirium, and cognitive impairment. Mental health inpatients present with psychosis, mood, trauma, personality, anxiety, substance use, and cognitive impairment. CAPS outpatients present with mood, anxiety, trauma, personality, adjustment difficulties, substance use, cognitive impairment, and developmental disorders (ASD and IDD). I supervise a PA one day/week, psychology residents, and practicum students in this role. I incorporate objective (e.g., WAIS-IV, WMS-IV, TONI-4, RBANS, Trails A&B, CVLT-II, etc.) and projective (e.g., Rorschach, H-T-P-F drawings) testing in my services, and provide intervention using third wave CBT (e.g., MBCT, ACT, DBT), client-centered, and psychodynamic approaches. The remaining .2 of my position is dedicated to teaching and research activities.
