The University of New Brunswick (Fredericton) seeks qualified candidates for a Research Associate position in the Department of Economics with specialization in Health Systems or Health Economics. This is for a 5-year term position. Applications should be received no later than **December 15, 2013**.

The successful candidate will plan and direct studies to investigate the current and future functioning of the health systems of New Brunswick and the other Maritime Provinces with regard to effectiveness, efficiency and cost. The successful candidate will be expected to design, lead and contribute to large-scale research projects on various dimensions of the health system in New Brunswick and the Maritimes, including cost-effectiveness of service delivery, evaluation of alternative delivery methods, and other dimensions of health system effectiveness and efficiency. These research projects will have been approved for support by the Maritime SPOR SUPPORT Unit, a new CIHR-funded health research program, or will be priority health-related research questions originating from the Government of New Brunswick.

The position will commence on March 1, 2014, subject to budgetary approval. The ideal candidate will hold a Ph.D. in Health Economics, health systems research, population health or related discipline; will have a minimum of three years relevant experience in a health research environment; experience designing and implementing research programs on the health system and experience writing and submitting applications for Tri-Council funding. The ability to utilize and manipulate statistical programs including STATA, SAS and/or R, will be an asset.
