**THE FORTWHYTE GREENWAY**

4.6 km (one way) | 60-90 minutes

**Surface type:** Crushed limestone



**STORIED PEOPLE'S TRAIL**

2 km (return) | 45 minutes

**Surface type:** Crushed limestone

(some uneven areas and inclines on trail)



**BIODIVERSITY TRAIL**

0.8 km (return) | 15 minutes

**Surface type:** Crushed limestone



**FOREST SONG TRAIL**

0.8 km (return) | 15 minutes

**Surface type:** Crushed limestone/

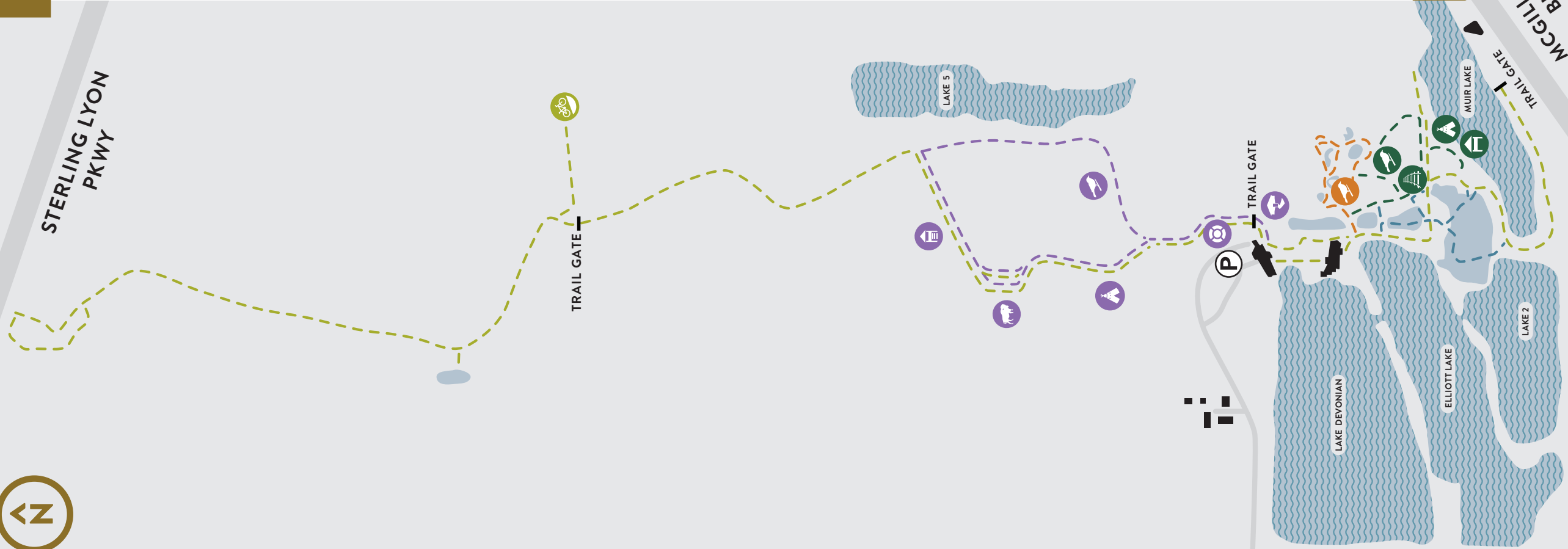
wood chips (railroad track across trail creates some accessibility issues)



**WETLAND BOARDWALK TRAIL**

1 km (return) | 20 minutes

**Surface type:** Floating/standing boardwalks (not very accessible by power/manual wheelchairs, crutches or walkers)
