To participate in the competition, candidates must meet the following eligibility conditions:

- * be registered or have been registered in a Canadian higher education institution, in a thesis based research program during the current academic year (September 2019 to August 2020) or have obtained their degree during this academic year;
- * participation of masters students is encouraged; however, eligibility in the National Competition is restricted to Ph.D. candidates;
- * applicants are only allowed one slide, no animation is allowed, to illustrate their words. This will be projected on a screen during their presentation;
- * be French-speaking or speak French;
- * be available and present in Sherbrooke, May 5 and 6, 2020 (schedule an afternoon departure on the 7th, as the winners will have an interview at the end of the morning on the 7th), in order to present themselves at the national final and the preparatory meeting, which will take place at the 88 th Acfas Congress;
- * present a sufficient state of progress of their doctoral research project;
- * not having won jury or public awards at a previous national competition for My thesis in 180 seconds;
- * the winner who received the first prize from the jury at the national final must be available and present at the international final and related activities.
