Sally Ito is a writer and translator. She was born in Taber, Alberta, and currently lives in Winnipeg. She has published three books of poetry, "Frogs in the Rain Barrel," "A Season of Mercy," and "Alert to Glory," as well as a collection of short stories called "Floating Shore." In 2018, she published a cultural memoir, "The Emperor's Orphans." Ito has also translated and published the Japanese children's poet Misuzu Kaneko by drawing on her years of study in Japan and experience in translating contemporary Japanese poetry. Ito's most recent book (poetry) will be the forthcoming "Heart's Hydrography" to be published and launched in October 2022. She teaches creative writing in Winnipeg and is a former blog contributor to the multicultural children's literature blog and website, PaperTigers.
