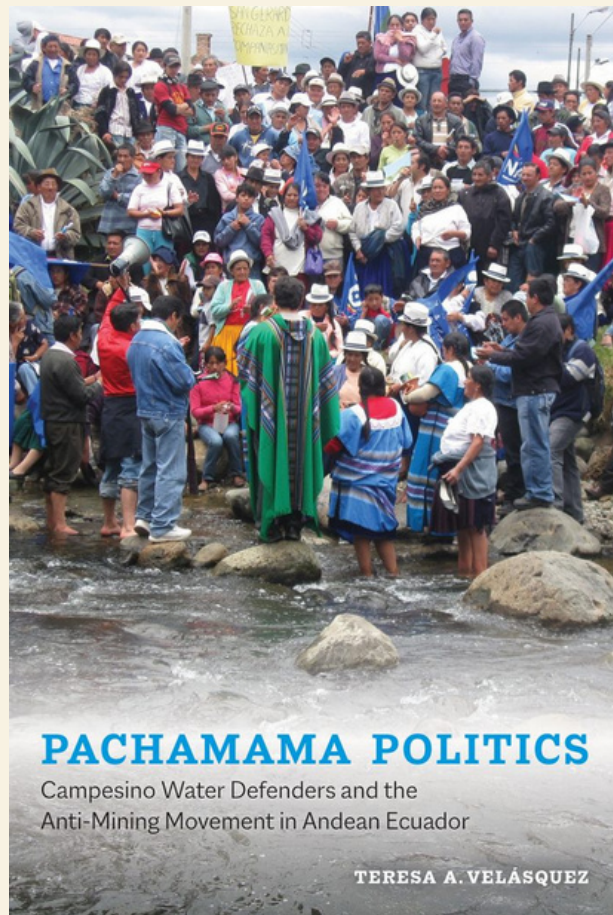

Pachamama Politics

A Book Lecture by Dr. Teresa Velasquez (California State University, San Bernardino)

In this book talk, *Pachamama Politics*, Teresa Velásquez discusses her research among a group of Ecuadorian farmers organized to defend community watersheds from a proposed Canadian gold mine project. Her work exposes the rifts over government plans to pursue extraction in the name of Sumak Kawsay (to live well), and how farmers transformed their relationship to Indigeneity in unexpected ways.
