Hidden from the Nazis as a very young child in occupied France, raised in French orphanages and by adopted parents in New York, Suzanne Weiss began in her teens a quest to understand the mystery of her origins and the miracle of her survival. As a participant in activist struggles since 1958, Suzanne has stood for the cause of global labour and economic justice, women's liberation, defense of racialized minorities, justice for Palestine, indigenous rights, and defense of the environment. Suzanne's just-published memoir, *Holocaust to Resistance: My Journey*, applies the lessons of her wartime survival to the challenges we all face today.
